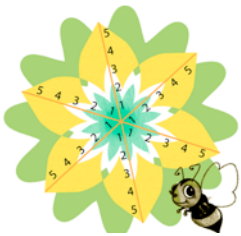


Apple Names & Games



Step 1: Taste Some Mystery Local Apples

A crucial step in any food literacy activity - tasting! Choose at least two varieties of apples so that your students can compare and contrast the different flavours, textures and appearances. Keep the apple names a secret.



Step 2: Judge The Mystery Local Apples

Use our tried and trusted tasting graph (over the page) to guide your judging session. Create your own criteria and record on each petal before finding out which apples were most popular and why. You can also create original "tasting profiles" for each student if you want to!

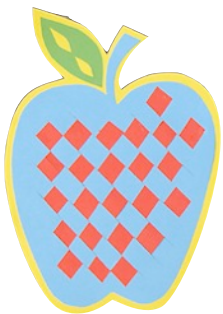


Step 3: Rename The Mystery Local Apples

Together with the students, brainstorm a column of adjectives and a column of nouns related or unrelated to apples. In pairs or teams, have students create new names for the mystery apples by pairing the adjectives and nouns together.

Adjective examples: crunchy, loud, sneaky, tangy, sweet, pink, shiny, round, tiny...

Noun examples: beauty, bulb, sphere, candy, winter, flower, or a student's name...



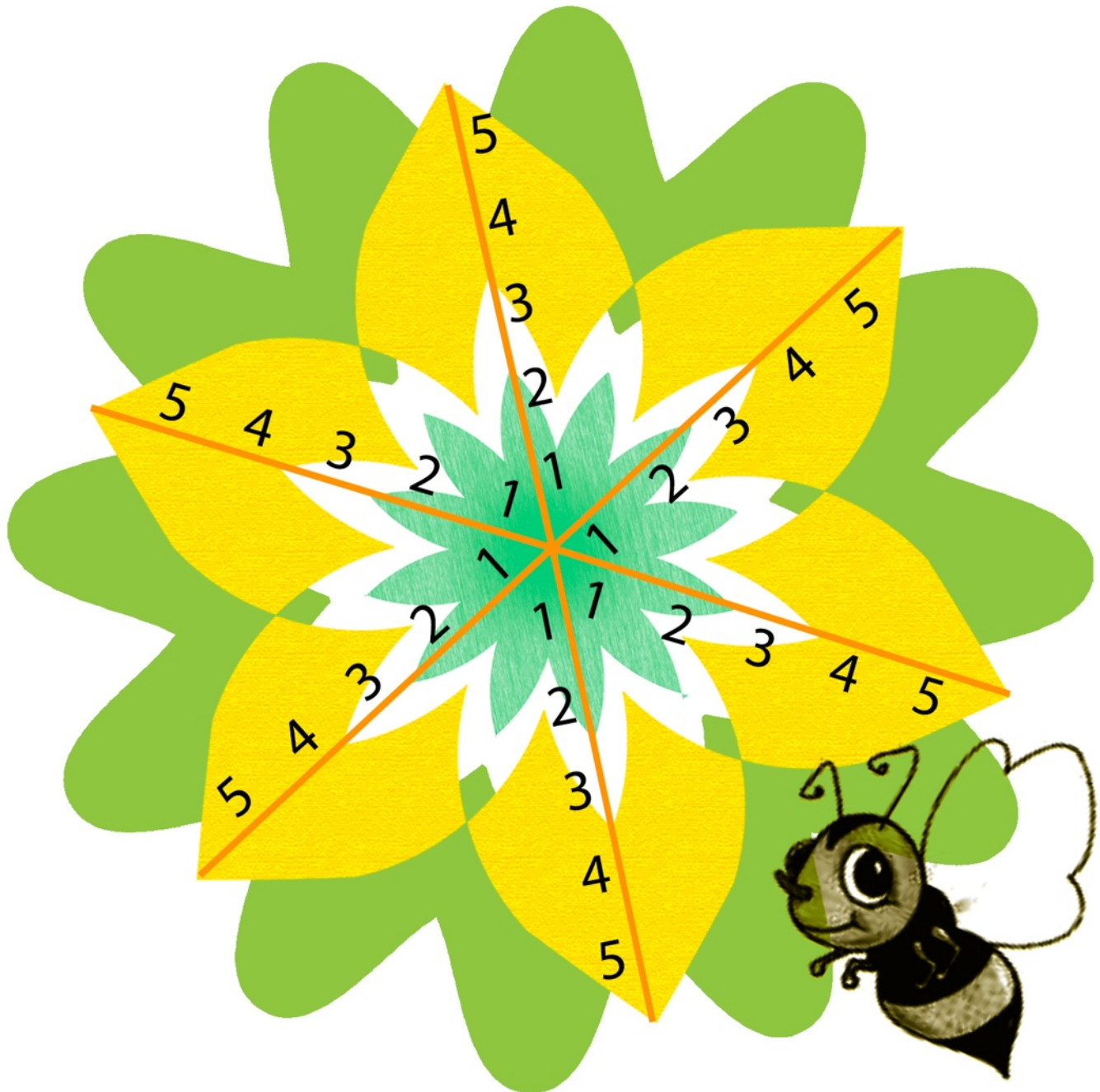
Step 4: Play With Your Food!
